Since their return to school after the COVID-19 pandemic, many teachers in Sweden have been putting a new emphasis on printed books, quiet reading time, and handwriting practice. They are now spending less time on tablets, independent online research, and typing skills. The return to more traditional ways of learning is a response to politicians and experts questioning whether Sweden's digitalized approach to education, including the introduction of tablets in nursery schools, had led to a decline in basic skills.

Sweden's Minister of Schools was one of the biggest critics of overusing technology. She said in a statement in March 2023 that "Sweden's students need more textbooks," because she believes that printed books are important for student learning. In August, the Swedish government announced plans to go further and completely end digital learning in schools with children under the age of six, the Ministry told the Associated Press.

Swedish fourth-grade students' reading scores on the Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) were above the European average in 2021. Nevertheless, between 2016 to 2021 the students' scores actually declined in Sweden. In 2021, Swedish fourth graders averaged 544 points, a drop from the 555 average in 2016. However, their performance still placed the country in a tie with Taiwan for the seventh-highest in overall test score. In comparison, Singapore improved its PIRLS reading scores from 576 to 587 during the same period. England's average reading achievement score fell only slightly, from 559 in 2016 to 558 in 2021.

One possible reason for the lower score could be the increasing number of immigrants who do not speak Swedish as their first language. Education experts also say that the COVID-19 pandemic and the overuse of digital devices have caused young students to fall behind. "There is clear scientific

evidence that digital tools weaken rather than enhance student learning," reported a highly respected Swedish medical school in August. "We believe the focus should return to acquiring knowledge through printed textbooks and teacher expertise, rather than acquiring knowledge primarily from freely available digital sources that have not been examined carefully for accuracy."

The rapid adoption of digital learning tools also has drawn concern from the UN's education and culture agency (UNESCO). In a report published in August, UNESCO issued an "urgent call for appropriate use of technology in education." The report urges countries to speed up internet connections at schools, but at the same time warns that technology in education should never replace in-person, teacher-led instruction and should support quality education for all.

In the Swedish capital, Stockholm, a third grader expressed his approval of spending more school hours offline. "I like writing more in school, like on paper, because it just feels better, you know," he told the Associated Press. His teacher said she was careful about asking students to use tablets during lessons even before the government announced policy changes.

Confirmation bias is our natural tendency to seek out and accept information that confirms what we already believe and ignore information that does not. If a piece of information agrees with our beliefs, our instinct is to accept that it is true. We are often happy to learn this information. We tend to overlook any problems with it. We are more likely to recall it later. And we may be more likely to act on it.

Allowing confirmation bias to control how we understand new information can be dangerous. For instance, people naturally want to read news stories that confirm their existing beliefs. But that can make it easier for people to fall for fake news. Fighting our confirmation bias is especially hard online. Social networking services (SNSs) tend to connect us with people who already think like us. Computer programs fill our SNS feeds with content that we are expected to like, based on our past activity.

However, there are ways to resist confirmation bias in our lives. Simply recognizing this bias is one key step. Also, try to seek out information that you disagree with. Approach the information with an open mind, rather than immediately trying to find problems in it. Likewise, talk to people that you know you disagree with. Try to understand their opinion without getting defensive.

Exposing yourself to viewpoints that you do not agree with can be hard, but no one is right all the time. And there are merits to acknowledging you might be wrong. Confirmation bias may be leading you to believe something that is not true.
