The courses listed above are open to international students enrolled at MGU and taught in English (unless indicated otherwise). All other courses require the permission of the instructor, evidence of appropriate prerequisite courses, and Level 1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test.

Classes normally meet once or twice a week for **ninety minutes** (a total of 12-14 sessions per semester). The Japanese Language courses, however, meet for **6 ninety minute** sessions per week.

Shirokane-ISP Students are based on the Shirokane Campus, but are allowed to take courses offered at the Yokohama Campus should their schedule allow for the commute between the two campuses.

International students are expected to register for a minimum of 12 credits per semester. The average load is 14-16 credits per semester.

* Yokohama-ISP students can not register to the "Intensive/Basic/Practice Japanese" in Shirokane Campus.
