OEntering and using the library

A student ID is required to use the library. Pass your student ID over the entrance/exit gate to open the gate. Please do not forget to bring your student ID when you visit the library, as you will need it to borrow materials. Alumni may use the library after completing the procedures.

OBorrowing materials

A total of 20 books can be borrowed for up to two weeks (a total of 60 books for up to eight weeks for graduate students) from the Shirokane and Yokohama campuses combined. If no one else has reserved the book, the return deadline can be extended up to two times.

Only undergraduate students may borrow materials long-term during vacation periods.

You cannot borrow new materials if you are overdue returning any materials you have already borrowed.

OReservations

If the book that you want to borrow is on loan to someone else, you can reserve it.

OInter-site request service

Materials from the other campus can be obtained via inter-site request service. Requested materials are delivered on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

OBook purchase requests

If the library does not have a book you want to read, you can submit a purchase request.

MyLibrary is a portal site provided by Meiji Gakuin University Library.

In addition to checking lending/reservation status and renewing loan periods, you can also apply online for purchase requests, document copying, materials borrowing, and more. MyLibrary is even accessible from a home PC and smartphones.

There is a link to the login screen at the top of Port Hepburn, OPAC and the library website. Log in with the same ID/password as for Port Hepburn.

Use of computers

Activities permitted in the free-use computer labs

The computers can be used for report preparation, Internet search, sending/receiving email, taking online courses, etc. Please check the university website and Port Hepburn for details such as labs where it is permissible to play audio without headphones and to talk. Each room has a printer. Scanners and color printers are available in the Shirokane Main Building B1F and Yokohama Building 4 Y'ins.

Meiji Gakuin University's approach to BYOD

Meiji Gakuin University encourages BYOD (Bring Your Own Device), where students bring their own devices (laptop PCs) to the university and use them to learn autonomously and develop information literacy and ICT skills. In university life, devices like laptops are essential for various learning activities and daily tasks, which include preparing for and reviewing content using the learning management system (LMS) "manaba," creating and submitting reports, giving presentations, searching for syllabi, checking grades, and job hunting. By embracing BYOD, the learning environment extends beyond computer labs, allowing students to study anytime and anywhere.

Lending of laptops

OFor use on campus

Laptops (Windows, Mac) can be borrowed from PC lockers located in the Palette Zone and Information Lounge on the Shirokane Campus, from PC lockers in the Clara Lounge in Building 5 on the Yokohama Campus, and from the Information Center. Laptops are also available for borrowing from the library. Campus Wi-Fi access is available in nearly all areas of the buildings on each campus.

OFor use off campus

During the graduation these creation period, we will loan laptops for a limited time (at the end of the year) to students who are writing their graduation theses. There are a limited number available so recipients will be selected by lottery. How to enter, the entry acceptance period, and the loan period will be notified separately on Port Hepburn, bulletin boards, etc.
