## Scholarships

The scholarship system endeavors to encourage learning and equalize educational opportunities by providing incentives for students achieving superior academic performance and by providing support to students for whom schooling is economically difficult. Our university handles our own internal scholarships, Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) scholarship loans, and the scholarships offered by local public-sector organizations and private-sector scholarship foundations.

Scholarship guide materials are distributed at the Student Affairs Division window, which also handles inquiries and counseling concerning scholarships. Students in need of assistance because of a sudden change in their family's economic situation (the unemployment, long-term hospitalization, convalescence, death, or disaster-victim-status of the principal source of family financial support) should consult with the Student Affairs Division as necessary.

In the submission of applications please strictly observe the prescribed deadlines and window operating hours.

## Meiji Gakuin University scholarships

This is our university's own scholarship system. The funds are all provided as grants and do not need to be repaid later.

### Notice to recipients of Japan Student Services Organization scholarship loans

Students who have been granted JASSO scholarship loans and who are receiving those loan funds must, even after the loan is granted, follow various procedures concerning continuation and repayment while they are still enrolled here. Even after your scholarship loan has been deposited in your bank account, do not just sit back and assume nothing more is necessary. You need to regularly check scholarship loan information on the bulletin boards and Port Hepburn and the Student Affairs Department website. In addition, if your address or telephone number (mobile phone number included) changes, be sure to notify the Student Affairs Department window.

# Scholarships offered by local public-sector organizations and private-sector scholarship foundations

There are various types of scholarships offered by prefectures, cities, towns and villages to students who are resident there or were born there. Private-sector scholarship foundations also offer scholarships for various purposes. Essential application information for such scholarships will be posted on bulletin boards and the Student Affairs Office website as soon as it is received by the university.

There are a significant number of cases in which students directly apply for scholarships without going through the university. In such cases it is important to directly contact the relevant organization, such as the Board of Education, city hall, etc. of your hometown or current place of residence, or collect information on the Internet, etc.

## Student Credit Union

This system provides temporary loans to undergraduate students.

### Short-term loans

This system only provides loans when funds suddenly become necessary due to unforeseen circumstances such as sudden illness or loss of a purse or wallet.

## Special loans

This system provides temporary loans in cases where circumstances make it difficult for students to pay their university fees; the objective of the system is to provide support so that students can continue their studies. The period for applying for these loans lasts until the day after the final day of the period for submission of a payment deferral request for the given term.

### Support for students studying overseas

#### OLong-term overseas study

In the university overseas study program (long-term) under which students study overseas at partner universities of this university for six months to a year, the credits earned at the overseas university can be accredited as units of this university under certain conditions after the student returns to Japan. The overseas study period is also counted in the enrollment period, so it is possible to graduate in four years. The overseas universities are primarily located in the English-speaking countries but have been expanded to regions throughout the world, including the French-speaking world, the German-speaking world, the Spanish-speaking world, the Chinese-speaking world, and the Korean-speaking world.

#### **OShort-term overseas study**

We hold a short-term overseas study program using the summer break and spring break periods. The overseas universities are partner universities of this university and language schools certified by this university, and it is a high quality program. Students are awarded credits by participating in the program, submitting theses, and achieving a certain grade level.

#### **OSDGs Study Tour**

This is a study tour mainly aimed at students in lower grades that is held in the summer holiday period (in academic year 2018 it was held in Vietnam). It is a program centered on experiences and exchanges with the local people, and it enables the participants to strongly appreciated the SDGs (sustainable development goals) that have been stipulated by the United Nations.

#### **OUnited Nations Youth Volunteer Program**

This is a program that collaborates with the United Nations Volunteers and nine domestic universities to dispatch students as volunteers to developing countries. They are dispatched for approximately five months to United Nations offices and international institutions in developing countries.

Please confirm the conditions for application, the application times, etc. of each program in their respective application guidelines in Port Hepburn notices or the website of the International Center. We also accept consultations about other overseas study as needed. No appointment is necessary so please feel free to make an inquiry.

### International exchange activities on campus

#### **OBuddy Program**

The Buddy Program is a supporter program which acts as a school friend to exchange students studying at this university by answering their questions about study at the university or their life in Japan, and helps them to lead an enjoyable student life.

### **OForeign Students Association MGU**

This is comprised of and run by full-time international students at Meiji Gakuin University, regardless of their home country or region. It involves a wide range of activities, including exchanging information about classes, scholarships, and job-hunting, as well as networking events with people on and off campus, etc.

### **OHost Family Program**

Exchange students from countries around the world studying at this university further deepen their understanding of Japan through home stays, so we are widely recruiting host families to accept these students into their homes.

## Health support

At the Health Support Center we help students to maintain and improve their physical and mental health. Please make use of the services below.

### Regular medical examinations

For the early detection of health problems, we hold two annual medical examinations (in April and September or October). Since the fall examinations occur while classes are in session, we recommend that you have the medical examination in April.

### Issuing of Health Certificates

We issue health-related certificates to students who have undergone their regular medical examinations without fail every year. The Health Certificate is necessary for scholarships, job training and during job-search activities.

For fourth-year students or above, certificates in our university's format can be issued from the automatic certificate issuing machine. For students of other years and for certificates in other formats, please inquire at the Health Support Center window. (Applications are not accepted by telephone.)

Depending on the certificate data items, there may be cases where a certificate cannot be issued.

OHealth nurse counseling: Health counseling services are available every day. Please inquire during window operating hours.
 OEmergency measures: The health nurse will handle emergency measures for injury and illness. We will provide a referral to a medical specialist if the center is unable to treat you.

### Vaccines and MMR antibody checks

Details announced via Port Hepburn and posters.

Tetanus	Caused when the tetanus bacillus (in dirt or mud) invades the body via a wound, tetanus is an acute toxic disease in which toxins released in the body by the tetanus bacillus cause respiratory paralysis and stiffness/paralysis throughout the body. We recommend vaccination for persons engaging in many outdoor activities. The vaccination is free of charge. Announcements for persons wishing to have the vaccination are made in early May.
MMR antibody checks	Using a blood test, we check to see whether you have immunity to measles, mumps and rubella. This test is performed for students applying to partner/approved study abroad programs because some of the schools ask for a certificate indicating MMR immunity. The cost is born by the student. Dates and times are notified to the subject persons.

### Loan of first-aid kits

These can be lent out for seminar/club activities, events and training camps. Please apply at the window at least one week before the day you plan to borrow the kit.

## Health advice

### Olnsurance card for those living away from home ("distance residence health insurance card")

Emergency care at the Health Support Center is free of charge, but in cases where a doctor is consulted at a medical institution, the individual is responsible for bearing the expense. If you do not have a distance residence health insurance card, you will have to bear the entire cost. If your family home is far away, you should send a Certificate of Student Registration to your guarantor and follow the procedure for obtaining a distance residence health insurance card.

### **OSupport for stopping smoking**

Support for quitting smoking by doctors and health nurses and nicotine patches are provided for free. For the nicotine patch prescription, it is necessary to make an appointment for respiratory system counseling. Applications can be submitted at the window at any time.

### OAlcoholic beverage consumption

The degree to which a person can or cannot safely consume alcohol is determined by their physical constitution. You should never drink an entire glass or other container of an alcoholic beverage all at once, or encourage someone else to do it. If you do drink, drink in moderation. Do not pressure someone who cannot handle alcohol to keep drinking, because this can lead to fatal accidents. Also, take care to avoid drinking alcohol when you are not feeling well and when you are taking medicine.

### OAIDS

The number of AIDS cases is increasing, with more than 70 percent of persons infected with HIV being in their 20s or 30s. There are almost no subjective symptoms. Having a blood test eight weeks or more after possible infection will enable early detection and treatment. If the blood test is done earlier than that, the results may not be accurate. Free and anonymous testing is available at public health centers. It is not possible to find out the results of HIV tests when donating blood. Condom use is effective for preventing infection. Counseling is also available at the Health Support Center.

### OMeasles

Currently measles vaccinations are given under a system in which the vaccination is done two times. With the passage of years, in many cases the immunity level becomes inadequate so the second vaccination is recommended. If you are unsure about whether to get the vaccination, it might be a good idea to first have an antibody check to see if you still have immunity.

### OSeasonal and new influenza viruses

Symptoms of influenza viruses include sudden fever, coughing, sore throat, fatigue, nasal discharge/congestion and headache. Diligent hand washing and gargling are effective for prevention. If you are diagnosed with a new influenza virus, please report the diagnosis by making a telephone call to the Health Support Center without delay.

## Counseling for students

At the Student Consulting Center, counselors qualified as clinical psychologists are available to provide any student (graduate students included) with counseling concerning a variety of worries and problems.

In order to enhance student enjoyment of a more fulfilling university life, we coordinate our counseling support with the Faculties, academic departments, other internal departments/offices, external specialized institutions, etc. The confidentiality of individuals will be strictly protected so please feel free to speak with a counselor.

### Counseling content

Counseling can cover a wide range of issues. Here are some examples.

Interpersonal relations	You feel isolated and friendless; your relationship with a boyfriend/girlfriend is not going well; you cannot communicate well with teachers; you have problems in family relationships; etc.
Personality	You lack a strong sense of self and just go along with what others are doing; you take on too many tasks because you are unable to say no when asked; you always get bogged down because you avoid tasks that you need to get done; you lack confidence in everything you do, etc.
Studies/career	You cannot get interested in classes so you tend to not go; you lack the necessary number of units; you do not know how to study; you think you would like to quit school; you don't know what kind of job you would like to get, etc.
Mental health	You experience extreme mood swings; you cannot get motivated; you have trouble sleeping; you experience sudden heart palpitations or dizziness; you have a continuing vague sense of anxiety for no clear reason; you have a problem with overeating or refusing to eat; you stay up at night and sleep during the day and shun outside activities, etc.

## To participate in counseling

In principle, an appointment is required, but if a counselor has available time, you may be able to meet with one immediately. Counseling is available both in person and by telephone.

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## Information on part-time work and apartments

### Part-time work information

When working at a part-time job, please give priority to your studies and take care to arrange a schedule that is not so difficult that it adversely affects your health. Part-time jobs are introduced to students on Baito Net (the Meiji Gakuin University part-time job introduction system)". The work listings can be viewed from a PC or mobile phone at any time. The work listings can be viewed from a PC or mobile phone 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. It is necessary to register before using the system. Registration only has to be done once, so please register after reviewing the registration method below.

In cases where the actual work conditions differ from the advertized conditions, please contact the Student Affairs Division.



### In the case that international students do a part-time job (part-time work)

Please apply to the Immigration Bureau of Japan for a part-time work permit. Furthermore, it is necessary to be careful regarding the following.

- Hours you are allowed to engage in a part-time job: up to 28 hours a week, and up to 8 hours a day during long-term vacation periods.
- Places you are allowed to engage in a part-time job: part-time jobs at places in the amusement business are prohibited regardless of the content of the business.

If you violate this rule, you may be subjected to forced deportation procedures.

## Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research

Meiji Gakuin University students join the Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research program when they enroll. This insurance covers disaster and accident injuries occurring during education and research activities and during extracurricular activities for which notification was submitted to the university.

### Injuries covered by the insurance benefits

① During regular curricular activities or while participating in school events → Injury receiving medical treatment for 1 days or more

② While on campus other than while engaged in extracurricular activities, while commuting to school or in transit between university facilities → Injury receiving medical treatment for 4 days or more

③ While engaged in extracurricular activities inside or outside of school facilities with prior notification to the university → Injury requiring medical treatment for 14 days or more

<sup>\*</sup> In cases where the student is hospitalized for reasons ① to ③ above, there is a separate benefit payment starting from the first day.

### Procedure for insurance claims

- Immediately after the accident occurs, contact the Student Affairs Division to obtain an accident report postcard, student accident report and insurance claim form. Immediately after obtaining the accident report postcard and student accident report, submit them to the Student Affairs Division after filling them out.
- <sup>(2)</sup> When the injury recovery is complete, immediately fill out the insurance claim form and submit it to the Student Affairs Division.
- ③ The insurance company will transfer the insurance benefit amount to the student's designated account.

## Security system offered by University Co-op

Student comprehensive mutual insurance is a system of mutual aid between students. Participating students receive mutual insurance fund payments in cases such as where they are hospitalized with illness or where an injury sustained in

student life requires them to be hospitalized or commute to a hospital for treatment.

### **OSpecial characteristics**

- Since it is a non-profit program, sufficient security is provided with small premiums.
- Students are covered 24 hours a day until graduation, regardless of whether they are in Japan or abroad.

- Enrolments, changes, and applications for benefit payment can be carried out at the Co-op contact window on campus.
- We recommend taking out student liability insurance together with the mutual insurance.
