■ Support for career development

At Meiji Gakuin University, we provide career support via extracurricular courses, lectures, orientations, internships, etc., that are run by individual faculties and other organizations. Included are Faculty of Law extracurricular courses covering national examinations (administrative notary, real estate agent, IT passport, etc.); Faculty of Economics courses to support the obtaining of qualifications including bookkeeper, financial planner and the secretary exam, etc.; Center of Liberal Arts language qualification courses; and civil servant seminars for students aiming to become civil servants, etc. (See p.30 concerning extracurricular courses and qualification courses.)

The university also has a Career Center, which provides various types of support for job-hunting and career development.

■ What can students do at the Career Center?

○Students can benefit from Career Center guidance and extracurricular courses concerning employment and career development.

○Students can view and borrow books and other materials concerning career development and job search.

These materials can be not only viewed but also borrowed and taken from the premises. Up to two books can be borrowed at a time, for a period of one week.

○Students can search for employment opportunities.

Students can use the online Employment Support System (accessed via Port Hepburn) to view the employment opportunities and application guidelines that the university receives from companies, social welfare facilities and other organizations.

○Students can obtain career and job-search counseling.

○ Years of study required for graduation

The Masters' program and the first stage of the Doctoral program required two or more years of study and the second stage of the Doctoral program requires three or more years of study. Students who acquire the required number of credits and who successfully pass the final examination during that period are awarded a Master of Arts degree or a Doctorate, respectively.

○ Entrance examinations

Exams are held in the summer, fall and spring. Some faculties also have internal recommendation-based entrance examinations or early entrance examinations. For details, please see the graduate school website. We plan to post the introduction to the graduate school and the admission examination guide in the middle of May. The Graduate School Office handles inquiries and requests to view or loan past exam questions.

○ Academic advisor

At Graduate School the aim is to prepare a thesis under the guidance of an academic advisor. Registration in classes is carried out after obtaining the permission of an academic advisor.

○ Inter-university course program

This is a program under which students majoring in English literature, French literature, economics, sociology, or social work are able to take certain courses at other universities which have concluded an agreement with our university. Similarly, their students are able to take courses at Meiji Gakuin.

■ Non-degree students

In the graduate school, certain courses in the masters program accept non-degree students after screening. For more information, please contact the Shirokane/Yokohama Graduate School Office.

The Graduate School Office handles all inquiries concerning the graduate school (and non-degree students).
