

Scholarships

The scholarship system endeavors to equalize educational opportunities and encourage learning by providing support to students for whom schooling is economically difficult and by providing incentives for students achieving superior academic performance. You can check invitations for applications for scholarships handled by our university on the Student Affairs Office website's scholarships pages (university website top page ⇒ Campus Life / Job Placement Assistance ⇒ Scholarship ⇒ Scholarship).

Scholarship guide materials are distributed at the Student Affairs Division counter, which also handles inquiries and counseling concerning scholarships. (The guide is also posted to the Student Affairs Office website.) Students in need of assistance because of a sudden change in their family's economic situation (the unemployment, long-term hospitalization, convalescence, death, or disaster-victim-status of the chief breadwinner) should consult with the Student Affairs Division as necessary.

In the submission of applications please strictly observe the prescribed deadlines and office operating hours.

◆ Application procedures

It is necessary to meet standards for all of these: (1) academic ability; (2) family finances; and (3) family assets. Please check the Student Affairs Office website for details. In principle, applications are accepted from enrolled students in the spring semester (April) and fall semester (September), but if your income suddenly decreases to a level equivalent to that of a household exempt from inhabitant taxes due to a change in the economic situation of your livelihood maintainer, you can apply at any time, even in the middle of the academic year. If you are applying due to a sudden change in your family's economic situation, you need to apply within three months from the time of the cause of that change, so please consult with the Student Affairs Division of your campus without delay.

■ Scholarships offered by local public-sector organizations and private-sector scholarship foundations

There are various types of scholarships offered by prefectures, cities, towns and villages to students who are resident there or were born there. Private-sector scholarship foundations also offer scholarships for various purposes. Essential application information for such scholarships will be posted on the Student Affairs Office website and bulletin boards as soon as it is received by the university.

There are also cases in which students directly apply for scholarships without going through the university. In such cases it is important to directly contact the relevant organization, such as the Board of Education, city hall, etc. of your hometown or current place of residence, or collect information on the Internet, etc.

■ Student Credit Union

This system provides temporary loans to undergraduate students.

■ Short-term loans

This system only provides loans when funds suddenly become necessary due to unforeseen circumstances such as sudden illness or loss of a purse or wallet.

Application period	In principle, while classes are in session (including the end of term examination period)
Loan amount	¥5,000 (interest-free loan provided immediately)
Application method	Loan applications are accepted at the Student Affairs Division at both the Shirokane and Yokohama campuses, but repayment should be done at the same campus where the loan was received. Loans involving both campuses are not allowed; nor are multiple loans at the same campus.
Repayment deadline	Repayment is to be made within two weeks of the day the loan is received. In cases where repayment performance is bad, loans will no longer be provided.

■ Special loans

This system provides temporary loans in cases where circumstances make it difficult for students to pay their university fees; the objective of the system is to provide support so that students can continue their studies. The period for applying for these loans lasts until the day after the final day of the period for submission of a payment deferral request for the given term.

Application deadline	By the day after the final day of the period for submission of a university fees payment deferral request for the given semester
Loan amount	The upper limit is an amount equal to one-half of the total of tuition for the subject term plus facilities fees for the subject term.
Application method	Loan applications are accepted at the Student Affairs Division at both the Shirokane and Yokohama campuses. After document screening and an interview, the President makes the decision whether to approve the loan.
Repayment deadline	Repayment is to be made (either as a lump sum or in instalments) within six months counting from the month after the one in which the loan was received. However, in the case of students in their graduation year, payment is to be made while the student is still enrolled.

■ International exchange

At the International Center (IC), we support a variety of international exchange activities so that all of our students can grow through contact with diverse cultures and values. If you would like to try studying overseas or would like to try participating in international exchange activities, please feel free to come to the center.

■ Studying abroad

The International Center offers a variety of programs, including long-term study abroad programs for one to two semesters, short-term study abroad programs that allow students to participate during summer and spring vacation periods, and internships overseas. ■ International exchange activities on campus

Opportunities are provided for international exchange that you can experience while you are in Japan, such as Buddy Program to support international students as friends and various events where you can interact with international students.

■ For international students

The International Center helps international students, including full-time international students and exchange students, to have a fulfilling campus life. Please feel free to drop by.

○Renewal or change of status of residence

If you have a “Student” status of residence, you will be asked to submit a copy of your residence card each time you renew your status of residence and/or period of stay in order to confirm your status of residence and period of stay.

In addition, if you are a foreign student in Japan enrolled at Meiji Gakuin University who has changed your status of residence to the status of residence of “College Student” stipulated in the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act while enrolled in the University, please submit a copy of your juminhyo (certificate of residence) or residence card to the International Center.

■ Health support

At the Health Support Center we help students to maintain and improve their physical and mental health. Please make use of the services below.

■ Regular medical examinations

For the early detection of health problems, we hold two annual medical examinations (in March or April and September or October). Since the fall examinations occur while classes are in session, we recommend that you have the medical examination in spring.

■ Issuing of Health Certificates

We issue health-related certificates to students who have undergone their regular medical examination for the current academic year. Certificates cannot be issued in the absence of a regular medical examination. A Health Certificate or Test Results Certificate is required for scholarships, practical training, and job hunting.

Certificates in our university's format can be issued from the automatic certificate issuing machine. For certificates in other formats, a Health Certificate will be issued for undergraduates (fourth-year students and above) and graduate students, and a Test Results Certificate will be issued for students of other years. For other certificates, please inquire at the Health Support Center counter. (Applications are not accepted by telephone.)

Depending on the certificate data items, there may be cases where a certificate cannot be issued.

■ Health counseling and emergency measures

○Doctor counseling: All require appointments.

○Health nurse counseling: Health counseling services are available every day. Please inquire during counter operating hours.

○Emergency measures: The health nurse will handle emergency measures for injury and illness. We will provide a referral to a medical specialist if the center is unable to treat you.

■ MMR antibody checks

Details announced via Port Hepburn and posters.

MMR antibody checks	Using a blood test, we check to see whether you have immunity to measles, mumps and rubella. This test is performed for students applying to partner/approved study abroad programs, because some of the schools ask for a certificate indicating MMR immunity. The cost is born by the student. Dates and times are notified to applicants.
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■ Loan of first-aid kits

These can be lent out for seminar/club activities, events and training camps. Please apply at the counter **at least one week before the day you plan to borrow the kit.**

■ Health advice

○Insurance card for those living away from home (“distance residence health insurance card”)

Emergency care at the Health Support Center is free of charge, but in cases where a doctor is consulted at a medical institution, the individual is responsible for bearing the expense. If you do not have a distance residence health insurance card, you will have to bear the entire cost. If your family home is far away, you should send a [Certificate of Student Registration](#) to your guarantor and follow the procedure for obtaining a [distance residence health insurance card](#).

○Support for stopping smoking

Support for quitting smoking by doctors and health nurses and nicotine patches are provided for free. For the nicotine patch prescription, it is necessary to make an appointment for respiratory system counseling. Applications can be submitted at the counter at any time.

○Alcoholic beverage consumption

The degree to which a person can or cannot safely consume alcohol is determined by their physical constitution. You should never drink an entire glass or other container of an alcoholic beverage all at once, or encourage someone else to do it. If you do drink, drink in moderation. Do not pressure someone who cannot handle alcohol to keep drinking, because this can lead to fatal accidents. Also, take care to avoid drinking alcohol when you are not feeling well and when you are taking medicine.

○AIDS

More than 70 percent of persons infected with HIV are in their 20s or 30s. There are almost no subjective symptoms. Having a blood test eight weeks or more after possible infection will enable early detection and treatment. If the blood test is done earlier than that, the results may not be accurate. Free and anonymous testing is available at public health centers. It is not possible to find out the results of HIV tests when donating blood. Condom use is effective for preventing infection. Counseling is also available at the Health Support Center.

○Measles

Currently measles vaccinations are given under a system in which the vaccination is done two times. With the passage of years, in many cases the immunity level becomes inadequate so the second vaccination is recommended. If you are unsure about whether to get the vaccination, it might be a good idea to first have an antibody check to see if you still have immunity.

○COVID-19 and influenza

Boosting your immune system through nutrition and rest, diligent hand washing, ventilation, gargling, and mask wearing in high-risk situations are effective for prevention. If you are diagnosed, please enter a report into the Port Hepburn reporting form.

○About other university infectious diseases

■ Counseling for students

At the Student Consulting Center, counselors qualified as clinical psychologists or certified public psychologists are available to provide any student (graduate students included) with counseling concerning a variety of worries and problems.

In order to enhance student enjoyment of a more fulfilling university life, we coordinate our counseling support with the Faculties, academic departments, other internal departments/offices, external specialized institutions, etc. We pay careful attention to confidentiality, so please feel free to speak with a counselor.

■ Counseling content

Counseling can cover a wide range of issues. Here are some examples.

Interpersonal relations	You feel isolated and friendless; your relationship with a boyfriend/girlfriend is not going well; you cannot communicate well with teachers; you have problems in family relationships; etc.
Personality	You lack a strong sense of self and just go along with what others are doing; you take on too many tasks because you are unable to say no when asked; you always get bogged down because you avoid tasks that you need to get done; you lack confidence in everything you do, etc.
Studies/career	You cannot get interested in classes so you tend to not go; you lack the necessary number of units; you do not know how to study; you think you would like to quit school; you don't know what kind of job you would like to get, etc.
Mental health	You experience extreme mood swings; you cannot get motivated; you have trouble sleeping; you experience sudden heart palpitations or dizziness; you have a continuing vague sense of anxiety for no clear reason; you have a problem with overeating or refusing to eat; you stay up at night and sleep during the day and shun outside activities, etc.

■ To participate in counseling

In principle, an appointment is required, but if a counselor has available time, you may be able to meet with one immediately. Counseling is available in person, by telephone, and online.

■ Academic support

The Student Support Center offers a variety of support while collaborating and coordinating with academic departments and graduate schools and related sections, related external institutions, etc. as the general support counter for students requiring assistance in attending classes, and student life due to disabilities, sickness, or injuries, etc.

Support is provided according to the needs of each individual student. Examples and procedures for receiving support are posted on the website, so please contact us if you would like to receive support. Also, please feel free to consult with us first if you are not sure whether you can receive support, are unsure if there is a support option suitable for you, or are uncertain about whether to receive support. "I am in trouble but..." "Somehow things are not going well" "What should I do?" – at times like these feel free to talk to us.

Academic support	We provide academic support to students with disabilities (visual impairment, hearing impairment, physical disabilities, developmental disabilities, etc.) as well as students with temporary learning impediments caused by illness or injury. Support content is based on the circumstances and needs of the individual student.
Training of student support staff	We train student support staff via note-taking courses and other activities. Details are announced on Port Hepburn and posters.
Educational activities	We hold symposiums and other educational activities on the provision of support to disabled students.

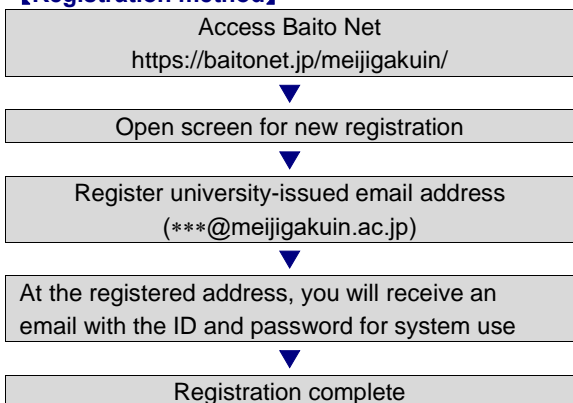

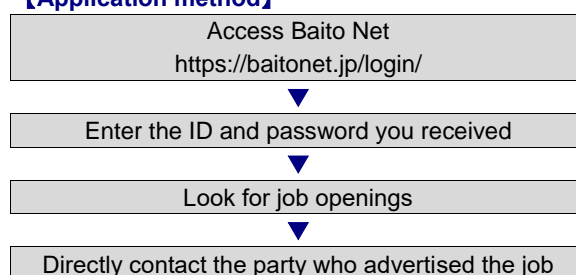

■ For international students doing a part-time job (part-time work)

Please apply to the Immigration Bureau of Japan for a part-time work permit. Furthermore, it is necessary to be careful regarding the following.

- Hours you are allowed to engage in a part-time job: up to 28 hours a week, and up to 8 hours a day during long-term vacation periods.
- Places you are allowed to engage in a part-time job: part-time jobs at places in the amusement business are prohibited regardless of the content of the business.

If you violate these rules, you may be subjected to forced deportation procedures.

■ Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research

Meiji Gakuin University students join the Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research program when they enroll. This insurance covers disaster and accident injuries occurring during education and research activities, during commuting to and from campus, and during extracurricular activities for which notification was submitted to the university.

■ Injuries covered by the insurance benefits

- ① During regular curricular activities or while participating in school events → Injury receiving medical treatment for 1 days or more
- ② While on campus other than while engaged in extracurricular activities, while commuting to school or in transit between university facilities → Injury receiving medical treatment for 4 days or more
- ③ While engaged in extracurricular activities inside or outside of school facilities with prior notification to the university → Injury requiring medical treatment for 14 days or more

* In cases where the student is hospitalized for reasons ① to ③ above, there is a separate benefit payment starting from the first day.

■ Procedure for insurance claims

- ① Immediately after the accident occurs, contact the Student Affairs Division to obtain an accident report postcard, student accident report and insurance claim form. Immediately after obtaining the accident report postcard and student accident report, submit them to the Student Affairs Division after filling them out.
- ② When you have completely recovered from your injury, immediately fill out the insurance claim form and submit it together with a copy of receipts to the Student Affairs Division.
- ③ The insurance company will transfer the insurance benefit amount to the student's designated account.

■ Security system offered by University Co-op

Co-op student comprehensive mutual insurance is a system of mutual aid between students. Participating students receive mutual insurance fund payments in cases such as where they are hospitalized with illness or where an injury sustained in student life requires them to be hospitalized or commute to a hospital for treatment.

There is a pamphlet available explaining the details so interested students should inquire directly at the Co-op contact counter at their campus.

○Special characteristics

- Since it is a non-profit program, sufficient security is provided with small premiums.
- Students are covered 24 hours a day until graduation, regardless of whether they are in Japan or abroad.
- The coverage content is especially suited to students
- Procedures can be carried out at the Co-op contact counter on campus and through your Co-op My Page (on a smartphone or PC).
- We recommend taking out student liability insurance together with the mutual insurance.
- Coverage can be continued after graduation under the New Working Adult Course.
